Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Redlands-Riverside's fourth annual Mansion Masquerade drew about 200 people to the Burrage Mansion in Redlands on Oct. 23. The Halloween-themed costume party, presented by Montecito Memorial Park and Mortuary, raised more than \$25,000 for the club. The event included food, drinks, dancing, a silent auction and two tours – one historic and one “haunted.” Local restaurants, including Jose's Mexican Food, Buffalo Wild Wings and Corner Bakery donated food, and Redlands' Hangar 24 Craft Brewery and Ritual Brewing Co. provided beer. The haunted tour took guests through a “zombie quarantine” zone on the mansion's grounds.
